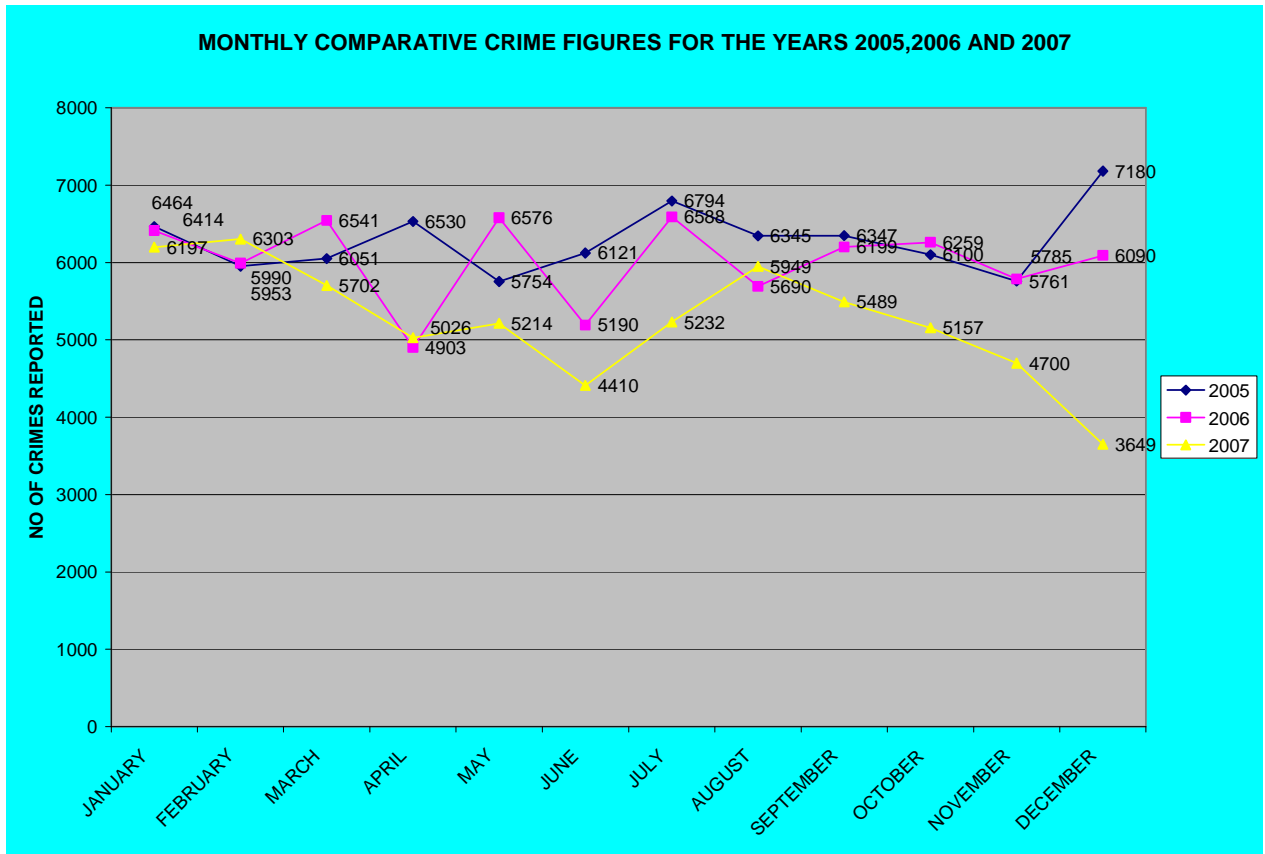

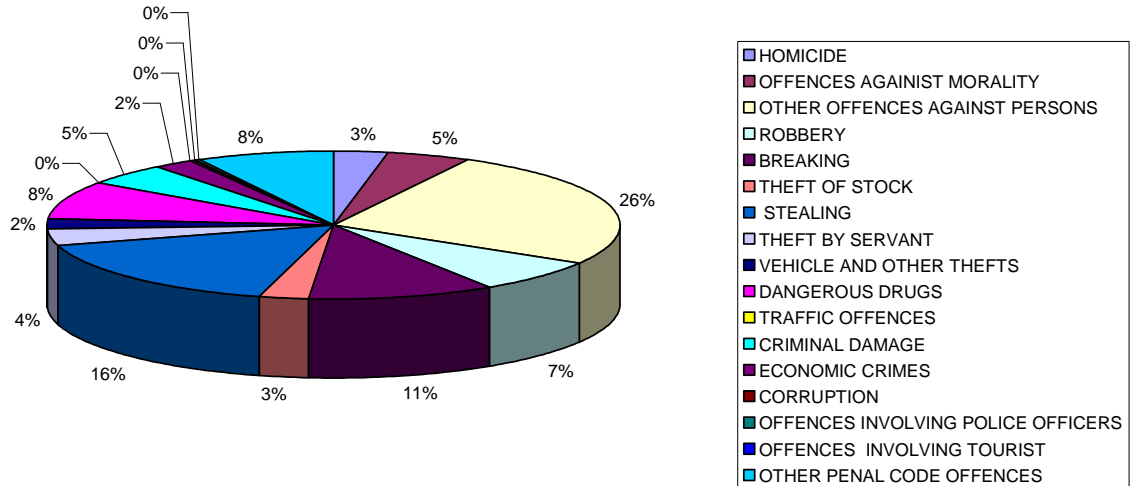

COMPARATIVE CRIME FIGURES FOR THE YEARS 2005,2006 AND 2007



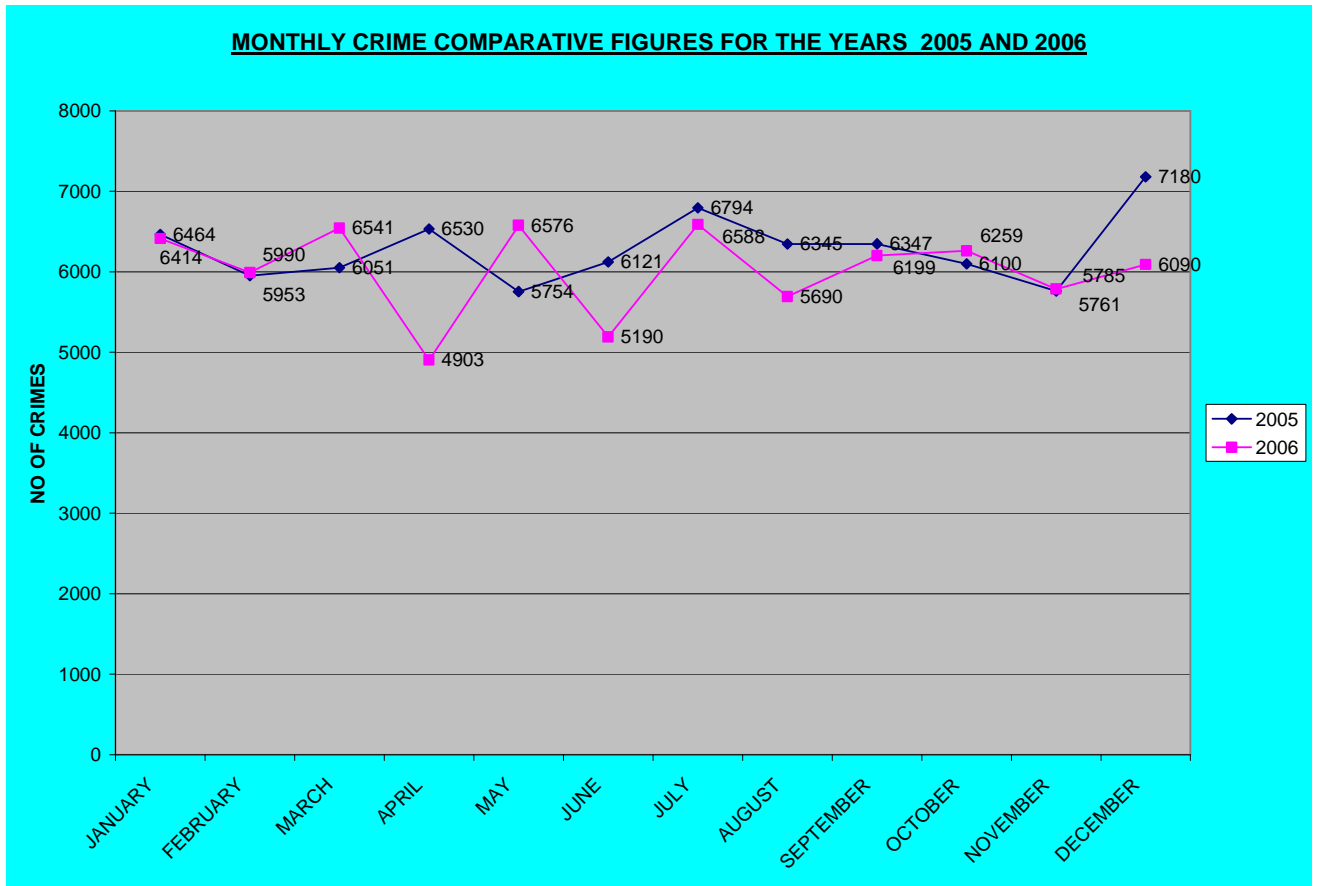

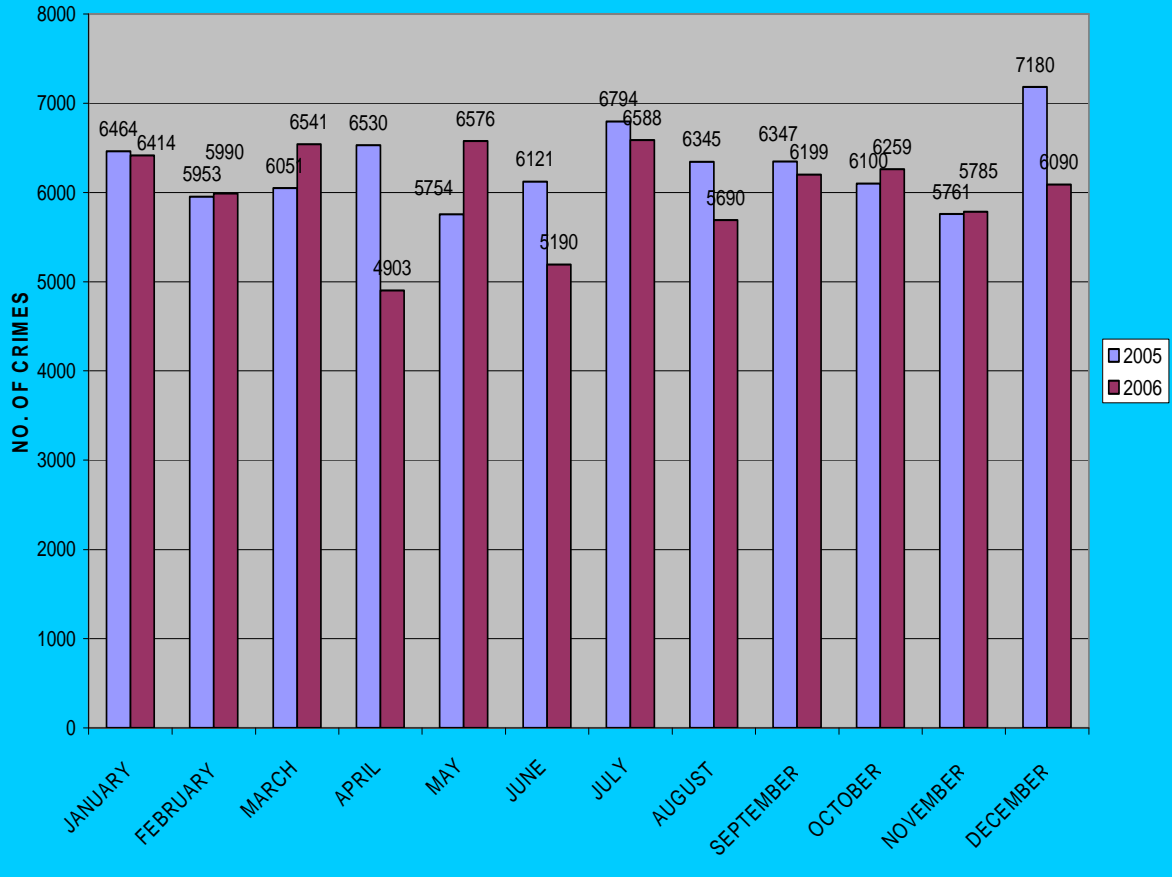

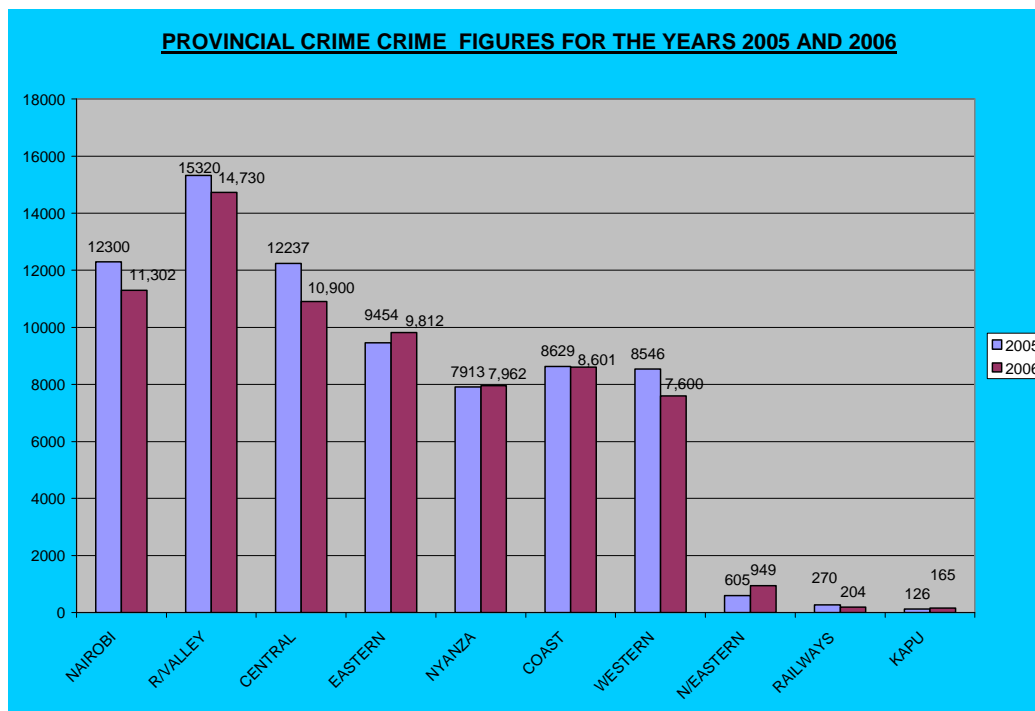
MONTHLY COMPARATIVE CRIME FIGURES FOR THE YEAR 2005 AND 2006

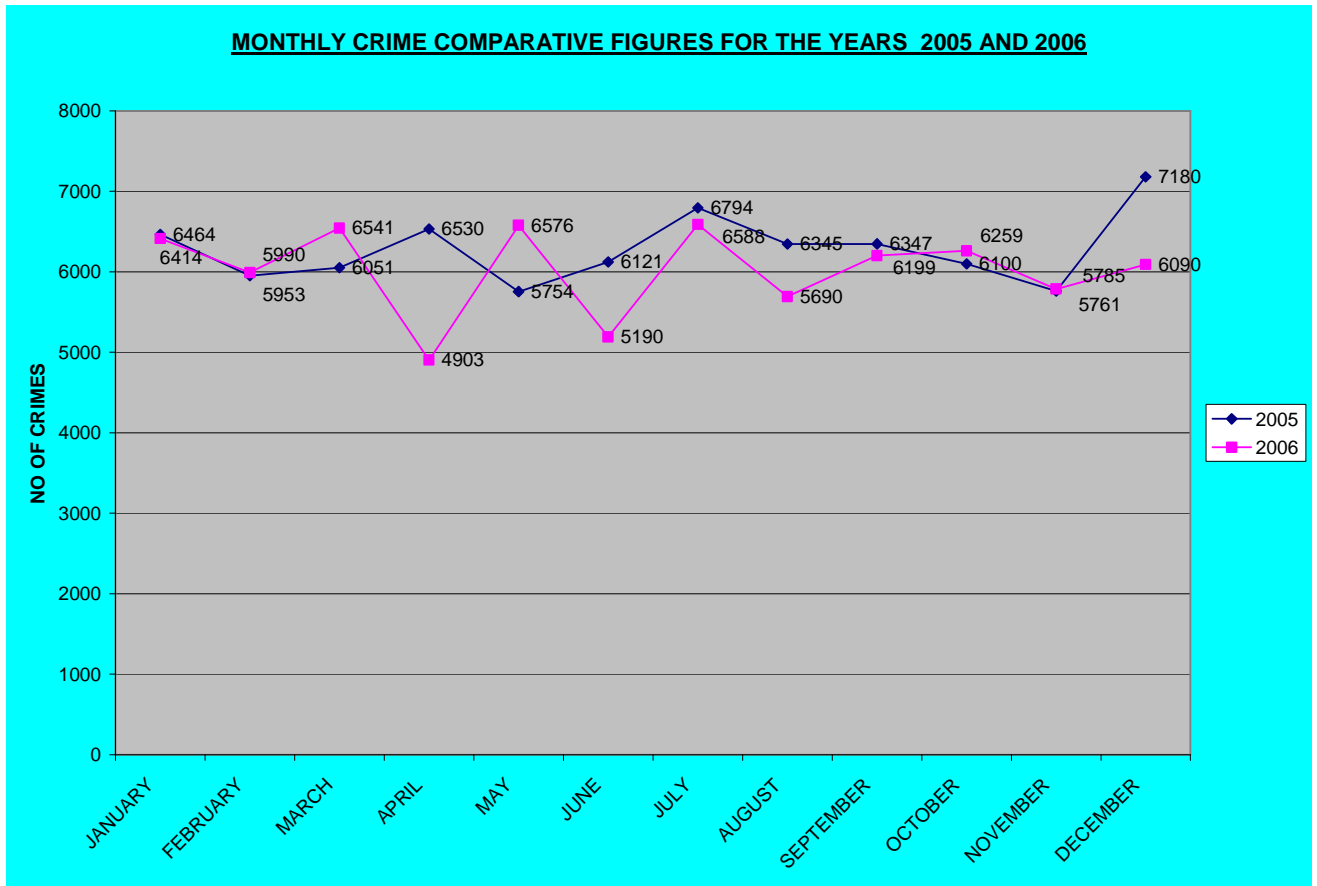

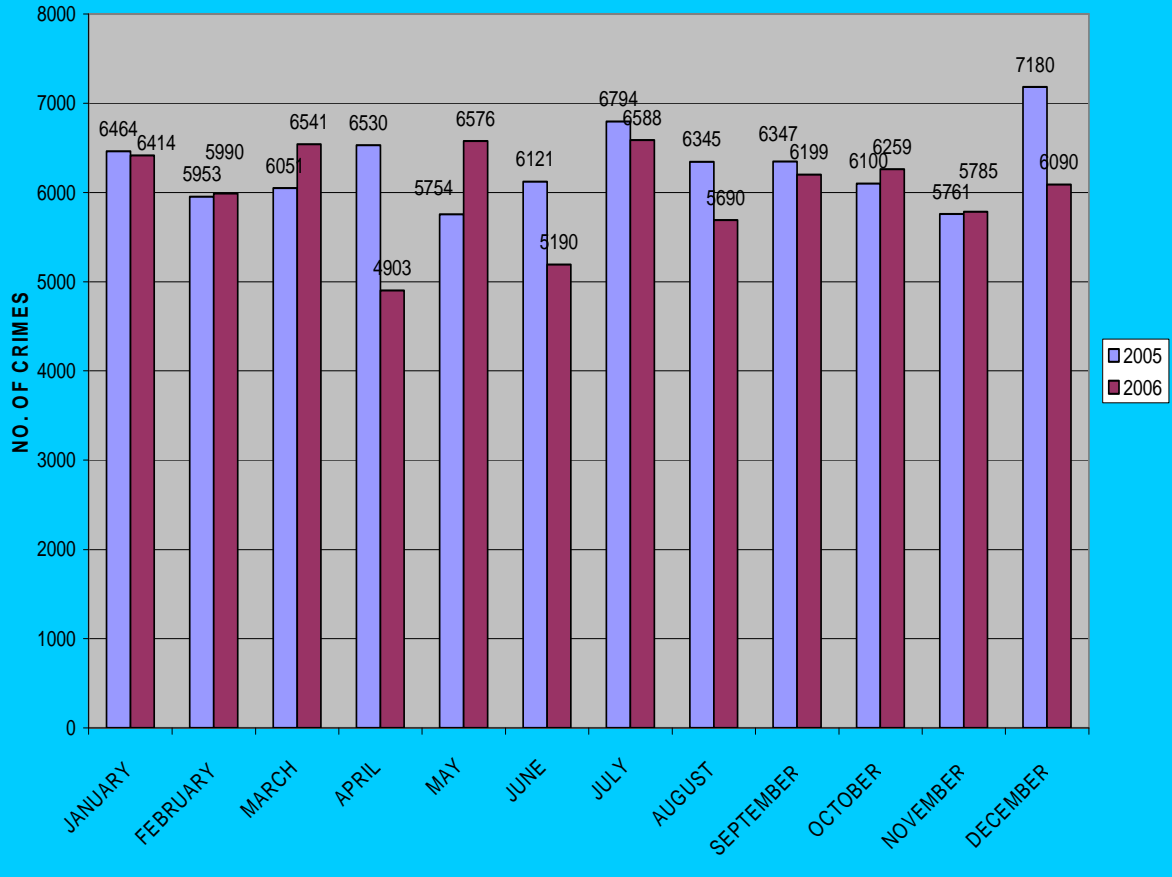

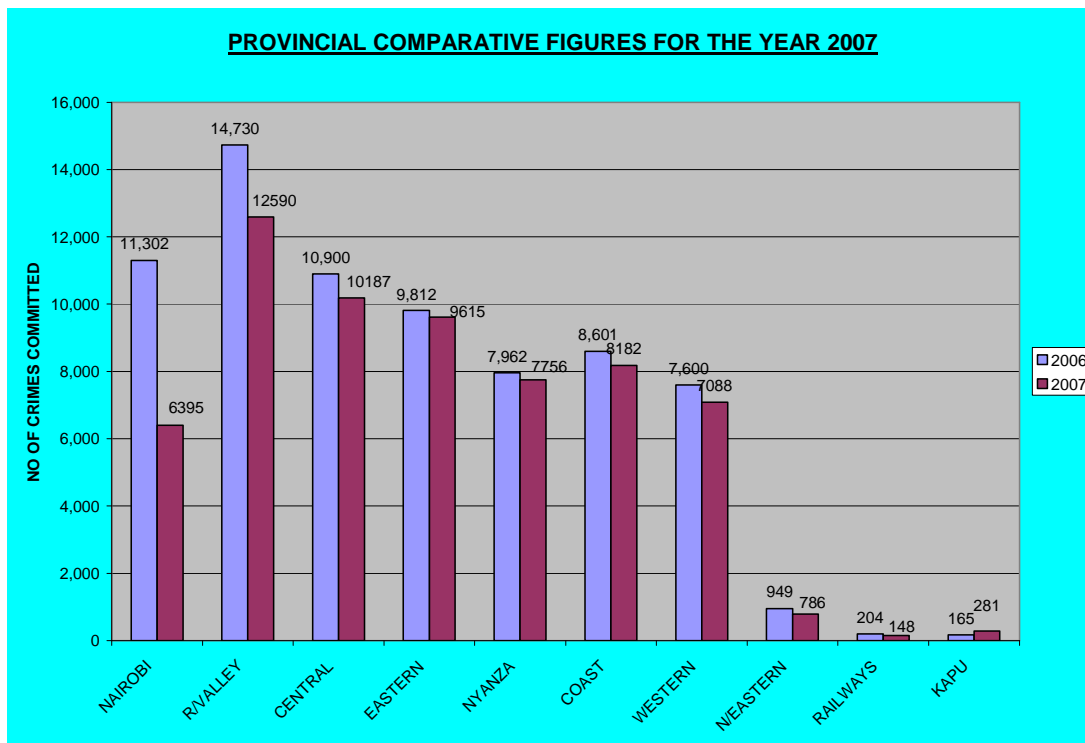
MONTHLY COMPARATIVE CRIME FIGURES FOR THE YEAR 2005 AND 2006

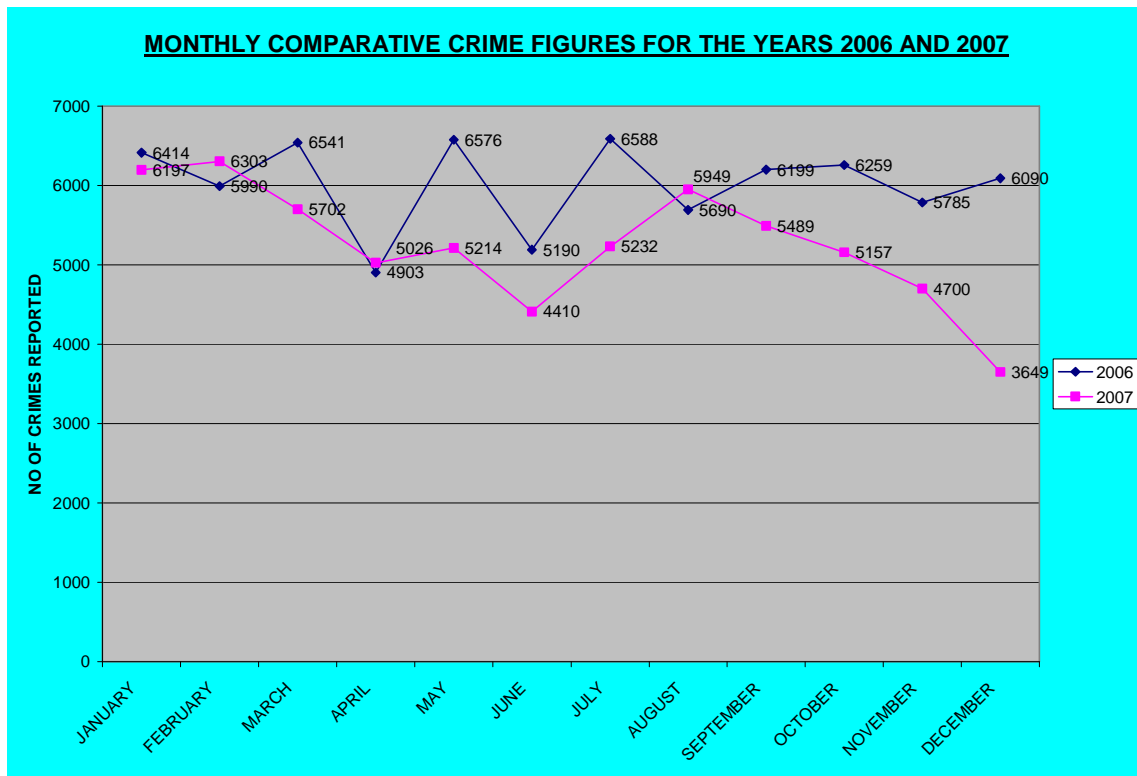


In our Provincial crime analysis, Nairobi Province recorded the greatest improvement in crime with a **43%** reduction, followed by North eastern with **17%**

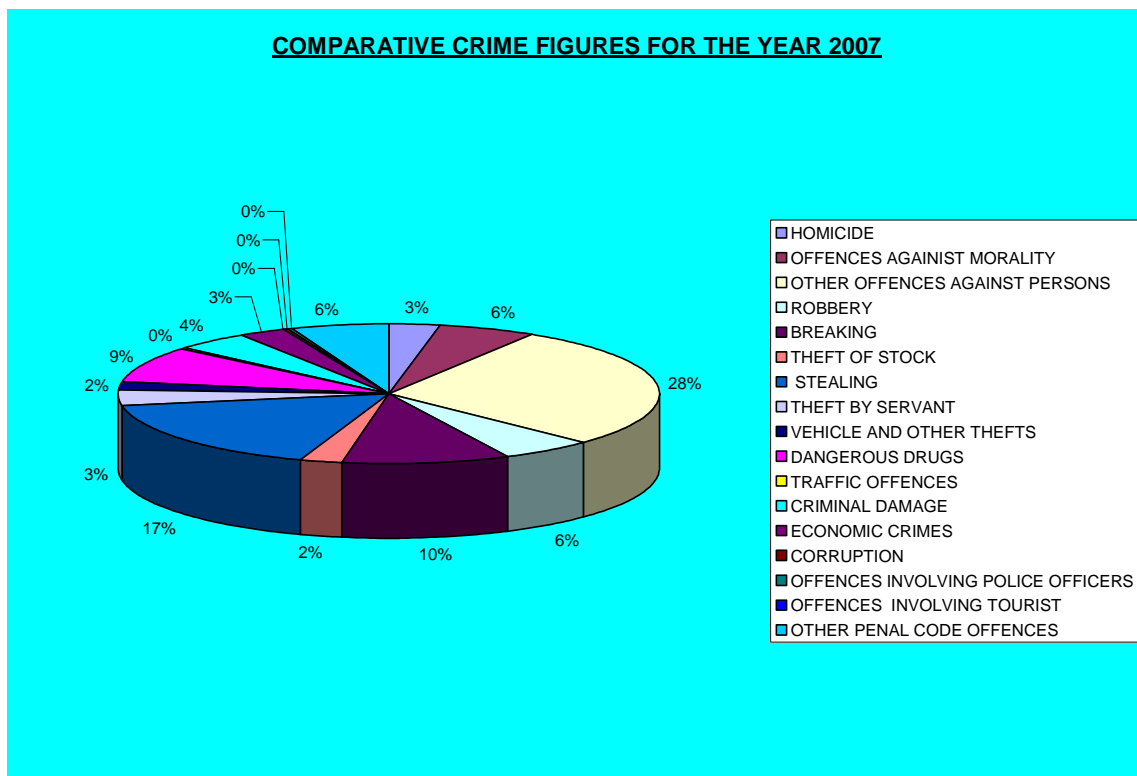

The monthly crime trend comparative figures in the following months recorded declines: - December **2441** Cases or **40 %**, May **1362** Cases or **21 %**, July **1356** Cases or **21 %**, November **1085** cases or **19 %**, October **1102** Cases or **18 %**, June **780** or **15%**, March **839** Cases or **13 %**, September **710** Cases or **11 %** and January **217** cases or **3 %**cases. Increases were noted in February **313** Cases or **5 %**, August **259** Cases or **5 %** and April **123** Cases or **3 %**.



CATEGORIES OF CRIMES

In the period under review, the national crime trends decreased by **13%** as compared to the previous year. Robbery, corruption, theft of stock, vehicle and other thefts, traffic offences, criminal damage, theft by servant, breaking, homicide, dangerous drugs, other offences against persons and stealing were on the decrease while Offences against morality and economic crimes increased across the country.
